The Leibniz-Institute for Baltic Sea Research (IOW) announces a full-time position for a
senior scientist

within the department of Biological Oceanography, which is to be filled as soon as possible. The payment for this position will be EG13 according to the German TV-L. If applicable the position will be initially filled for three years and can be transferred to a permanent position in the frame of a regulated tenure procedure.

The IOW is an independent institute of the Leibniz Society with a research emphasis on coastal and marginal seas in general and the Baltic Sea in particular. The scientists of the four departments (Physical Oceanography, Marine Chemistry, Biological Oceanography and Marine Geology) are working interdisciplinary within a common research program and with the support of a special working group for the development of new technologies. The tasks of the institute include the assessment and interpretation of long-term data in the Baltic Sea. For this the IOW is seeking the support of a Zooplanktologist with a profound expertise in taxonomy and experience in the application of modern techniques for the assessment of Zooplankton distribution. In addition, the successful candidate has demonstrated his or her ability to conduct independent research with publications in the area of Zooplankton ecology or a related topic. The ability and willingness to participate in scientific cruises is a precondition for this position.
