October 26: BUILDING YOUR GREEN HOME

With a focus on new construction and renovation projects, architect Andrew Miao will discuss how to design and plan a green home. Included will be information on the design process, types of materials available, where to get products, and the pros/cons.

November 2: WELLFLEET BAY'S GREEN BUILDING

This presentation by several presenters provides a broad overview of thenew design and renovations of Wellfleet Bay's Nature Center. Stu Weinrebof Mass Audubon will discuss why Mass Audubon is "going green", architect Andrew Miao will talk about his vision that went into the design, Suzanne Robinson of Green Round Table will introduce LEED certification, and Nicole Rosa of J.K. Scanlan (the contractors) has been invited to talk about the building process.


November 9: RENEWABLE ENERGY

Tom Wineman of Clean Energy Design will provide an introduction on incorporating PV, passive solar, and solar hot water heaters into one's home, and also highlight the possibilities of backyard wind turbines.

November 16: CONSERVING WATER

Bill Wall of Clivus will identify the problems inherent in traditional on-site sewage disposal systems and how composting toilets and greywater systems address these issues. Information on how they work and how to incorporate them into your home will also be provided. Gabrielle Belfit of the Cape Cod Commission will introduce stormwater recovery systems.
