AMHERST & NEWBURYPORT -- How do I interpret, and then do, what a soil test recommends? What do I do with a grub-infested lawn? Where do I get organic products and how do I use them? What is the systems approach to organic landscaping and how do I start doing it?

Answers to these questions and many more will be discussed in depth by Chip Osborne and Javier Gil, during the first-ever NOFA/Mass "Organic Lawns & Landscapes Refresher" workshops, happening Friday, August 12 from 8am to Noon at UMass Amherst, Campus Center Room 904-908, with Chip Osborne, in conjunction with the NOFA Summer Conference; and again Friday, August 19 from 9am to 1pm at the Parker River National Wildlife Refuge in Newburyport, with Javier Gil.
