Wastewater Planning on Cape Cod: What Are Different Towns Doing?

Cape towns are at different stages of planning and implementing wastewater/nutrient management strategies and it can sometimes be difficult to stay abreast of this dynamic process for all the towns. As part of the planning process, towns are being encouraged to consider a watershed-based approach to nutrient management efforts which adds another layer of necessary coordination to the intense efforts already underway.

This workshop will provide an opportunity to learn about where each town is at in their wastewater/water management efforts. Each town will provide a status update on their actions, experiences, lessons and next steps. Towns that share watersheds will discuss collaboration opportunities and needs, as well as ways to draw from each other's efforts to enhance public education and community engagement. This forum will complement ongoing efforts to share information among towns and further expose town officials, board members and other interested persons to the suite of wastewater-related activities in progress across the region. Information shared at this event will also feed into the first annual Cape Coastal Conference scheduled for June 13 and 14 in Hyannis.
