Restore America's Estuaries Announces Grants for Coastal Conservation and Restoration

Events in East Falmouth, MA on Friday, October 11 at 10 a.m. will highlight local organizations working to restore clean water and healthy coastal ecosystems.

Background: In 2012, Senator Jack Reed of Rhode Island led Congress in securing new funding to conserve and restore Southeast New England's coastal waters, watersheds, and communities. Sen. Reed's vision led the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to develop the Southeast New England Program (SNEP). Now, Restore America's Estuaries (RAE) is working with EPA to provide SNEP Watershed Grants, funding local organizations that are restoring clean water and healthy coastal ecosystems. In 2019, this program will award \$2.3 million throughout Southeast New England, including \$1.2 million to municipalities and non-profit organizations on Cape Cod and Buzzards Bay.
