Surface condition report from September 11th, 2012 is now available.

What you will find:

- Extensive and intense red-brown blooms in finger inlets in South Sound and the Kitsap Peninsula (in particular Dyes Inlet).
- Spectacular Puyallup river plume in Commencement Bay extending deep into the Tacoma Narrows.
- Jellyfish patches are getting very numerous and big in Budd and Eld Inlets.
